# The Faith Page

We attend Mass not only to witness the sacrifice of Christ but to become part of it.

"I appeal to you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God." - *Romans 12:1*

"May he [Christ] make of us an eternal offering to you [the Father], so that we may obtain an inheritance with your elect." - *Eucharistic Prayer III*

## Psalm 34:2-7

My soul makes its boast in the Lord; let the humble hear and be glad. O magnify the Lord with me, and let us exalt his name together. I sought the Lord, and he answered me, and delivered me from all my fears. Look to him, and be radiant; so your faces shall never be ashamed. This poor soul cried, and was heard by the Lord, and was saved from every trouble. The angel of the Lord encamps around those who fear him, and delivers them.

**Adults:** Today's psalmist is joy-filled because he called on the Lord and the Lord answered his call. The writer wants to exalt God's name "together" with others. Does God make you so happy that others ask, "What are you so happy about?" He should. Prepare yourself to answer that question. Think of at least two lines you can use to start a conversation about Jesus with a stranger. God will do the rest.

**Children:** Today's reading says we will be full of joy because God is in our life. Do you feel happy after you leave church? How do you express your joy? Think of a way you and your friends can "exalt His name together." You can talk about Him, sing about Him, or even create a project of some kind together. Try it this week.

## Salmos 34: 2-7

Mi alma se gloria en el Señor; que los humildes oigan y se alegren. Oh, magnifica al Señor conmigo, y exaltemos su nombre juntos. Busqué al Señor, y él me respondió, y me libró de todos mis temores. Míralo y sé radiante; para que tus rostros nunca se avergüencen. Esta pobre alma lloró, y fue oída por el Señor, y se salvó de toda tribulación. El ángel del Señor acampa alrededor de aquellos que le temen y los libera.

**Adultos:** El salmista de hoy está lleno de alegría porque invocó al Señor y el Señor respondió su llamado. El escritor quiere exaltar el nombre de Dios "junto" con otros. ¿Dios te hace tan feliz que otros preguntan, "¿Por qué estás tan feliz?" Debería hacerlo. Prepárate para responder esa pregunta. Piense en al menos dos líneas que puede usar para comenzar una conversación sobre Jesús con un extraño. Dios hará el resto.

**Niños:** La lectura de hoy dice que estaremos llenos de alegría porque Dios está en nuestra vida. ¿Te sientes feliz después de salir de la iglesia? ¿Cómo expresas tu alegría? Piense en una forma en que usted y sus amigos puedan "exaltar su nombre juntos". Puede hablar de Él, cantar sobre Él o incluso crear juntos un proyecto de algún tipo. Pruébalo esta semana.

**NEXT DISTRIBUTION IS AUGUST 20, 2018**

In 2016, the Atlantic City Office was able to provide food assistance to 1,358 individuals. Over 500 individuals, 50 of whom were homeless veterans, received rent or utility funding in order to prevent homelessness and disconnection. The office has also provided over 1000 changes of clothing, fresh hygiene products, and sandwiches to the homeless on Fridays.

The Atlantic City office, located at 9 North Georgia Ave., is open on Monday through Friday from 8:30 AM to 4:00 PM, and includes a food pantry, free baby supplies, and a thrift store.

Thrift Store Hours: 9:30-11:30 AM Mondays: Adult clothing, Wednesdays: Children & housewares, Fridays (except First Friday): Free clothing to those who provide proof of homelessness.

### ***The Franciscan Sisters have begun a renovation of the old St. Nicholas convent***

Since October, the Sisters have provided a simple ministry of presence and spiritual support to the neighbors on the first floor of the building. Now, they hope to have a handful of young woman move into the upper 2 floors and spend 8 months on site, acting as volunteer missionaries in the city. Many volunteers and skilled laborers have come forward to make the building livable, but more help is needed. The building has been renamed The Father Benedict House after the late Fr. ## BLACK CATHOLIC MINISTRY

**Heat related illnesses** - With temperatures consistently in the 90's, an article by Jenae Sitzes on the NBCC's website could be of extreme interest to everyone: The Difference Between Heat Stroke and Heat Exhaustion. Both dangerous heat-related illnesses, and while they share some of the same symptoms, there are fundamental differences to be aware of so you know when to seek medical attention. The precursor to heat stroke, heat exhaustion, occurs after exposure to high temperatures and humidity, usually combined with strenuous exercise and lack of adequate hydration. It can happen quickly or over several days. Heat Stroke is the most severe heat-related illness, and if it's not treated immediately, it can lead to death and often affect very young and elderly people who can't stay consistently cool. A person with heatstroke may stop sweating and have hot, red, dry skin, their body temperature rises rapidly, and they often become confused, have trouble walking, complain of a pounding headache, or feel dizzy or nauseous. The most important thing is to move them to an air-conditioned building to prevent their temperature from continuing to rise. Have them start drinking cool water, rest and loosen their clothing. Spray with cold water or take a cool bath and make sure they take it easy for the next few days. (bmwhitetoole@aol.com)


