100 DAYS SMARTER

Students and teachers celebrated the 100th day of school on February 7 with a variety of games and activities. The Faith Page

We attend Mass not only to witness the sacrifice of Christ but to become part of it.

"I appeal to you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God." - *Romans 12:1*

"May he [Christ] make of us an eternal offering to you [the Father], so that we may obtain an inheritance with your elect." - *Eucharistic Prayer III*

"Tacking into the wind"

In a previous assignment, I complimented a parishioner who had lost a lot of weight. "How did you do it?" I asked. "Atkins? South Beach? Paleo? Keto?" I still remember his answer: "Healthy eating, exercise, and enough sleep. They're the body's natural cleansers."

These days, a lot of people are prescribing cures for the Church's ailments, like constant scandals and dwindling membership. Some propose modernization, like diversifying the Church's leadership and promoting transparency and accountability. Others propose a return to former days of the Latin Mass and a distinct Catholic culture.

As a pastor, I can only help set the vision for our parish. At St. Monica's, my vision has always been doing the basics extremely well. So what does healthy eating, exercise, and sleep look like for our parish?

The average person's expectation of Church membership is growth in holiness, though they might express it with different words, e.g. "getting closer to God," "being more spiritual." This is why every bulletin has questions to help us reflect on the Sunday readings, why we've distributed booklets after Masses a few times over the last three years, why I offer a weekly Bible study. Most parishioners have many obligations, so I am less enthused about asking them to pass time at the parish in socials and fundraisers. People can be entertained elsewhere, but the Church is one of the few places that teach growth in holiness.

I also think our parish needs goals specific to its circumstances. Our parish has two great goals: the survival and growth of Our Lady Star of the Sea School and the interior restoration of St. Nicholas of Tolentine Church. These goals are ambitious. Star of the Sea School's enrollment has steadily declined in the last several years. Few families can afford the tuition, which is already subsidized by the parish and many wonderful donors. To persevere, the school will have to be creative. On the other hand, we know what it will take to restore St. Nicholas: about \$1 million!

The bishop launched the Catholic Strong campaign to help parishes raise significant funds for goals such as these. Unfortunately, we did not even raise 50% of our goal.

Although these goals came from you, the parishioners, I know that some of you lose faith when you are confronted with the considerable challenges of reaching them - and perhaps also the disillusionment from the national and international news about the Church. Perhaps you have wondered whether the time has passed for Star of the Sea School and St. Nicholas Church.

I want you to know your pastor's opinion: their time has not passed. A parochial school connects us with the wider community in ways that a religious education program or youth ministry cannot. Even non-Catholics respect our commitment to education. St. Nicholas's unofficial status as the "cathedral" of Atlantic City attracts the majority of the city's visitors and allows us to host important civic events. Imagine our parish with only Star of the Sea Church. Our ability to reach the community would be significantly impaired.

Help parishioners grow in holiness, grow Star of the Sea School, restore St. Nicholas. Let me add one more prescription for our parish's health. We have to reach out. The Catholic Church is hurting, but Atlantic City may be hurting more. Poor leadership, corruption, and apathy have hurt this city. We Christians know that money alone cannot fuel the city's renaissance. Moral and social development are even more necessary. The parish halls host a lot of civic events and I attend a lot more. I hope that our parishioners will be active members of their neighborhood associations. I hope that we will turn out in large numbers for meetings at which critical decisions will be made. It's hard to be proud Catholics these days. Despite that, we still have something to offer.

The good news is that we don't have to follow strange diets - or complex strategies - to save our parish during this crisis of the Church. The challenge is that doing the basics extremely well is going to take a lot of work. I hope that you will join me in seeing it through.

CATHOLIC CHARITIES

In 2016, the Atlantic City Office was able to provide food assistance to 1,358 individuals. Over 500 individuals, 50 of whom were homeless veterans, received rent or utility funding in order to prevent homelessness and disconnection. The office has also provided over 1000 changes of clothing, fresh hygiene products, and sandwiches to the homeless on Fridays.

The Atlantic City office, located at 9 North Georgia Ave., is open on Monday through Friday from 8:30 AM to 4:00 PM, and includes a food pantry, free baby supplies, and a thrift store.

Thrift Store Hours: 9:30-11:30 AM Mondays: Adult clothing, Wednesdays: Children & housewares, Fridays (except First Friday): Free clothing to those who provide proof of homelessness.

Catholic Charities' case managers in Atlantic County provide a wide variety of services. Some examples are utility and rental assistance, disaster services in response to Hurricane Sandy as well as the Atlantic City casino closings, assistance to veterans who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless, and financial coaching and education which includes the opportunity for clients to open matched savings accounts which can be used for them to purchase a home, start a business, or further their education.

BEGGARS POLICY

At recent meetings, the pastoral council has discussed the challenge of beggars on our grounds and in our churches. The council approved this policy.

1. Soliciting money from parishioners and others on our property is grounds for immediate removal by staff or police. Therefore, parishioners are asked not to encourage solicitors by giving money.

If you have been solicited, you may report it to the Welcome & Information Center or an usher. If you want to help personally, a safe alternative to giving money is buying food at the 7 Eleven locations next to Star of the Sea and St. Nicholas.

2. Beggars are welcome to come to the parish office during weekday business hours or to the Welcome & Information Center during weekend Masses. At the office, they can receive a light meal and a personal referral to a social service agency. At both the office and the Welcome Centers, they can receive a package with a pair of socks, a hat and/or gloves.

3. Homeless are generally welcome to sleep in the parish churches outside of Mass. Sleeping during Mass, however, is grounds for removal from the church.

If someone is sleeping during Mass, you may report it to the Welcome & Information Center or an usher.
